Now, you can earn certificates in World Language Proficiency, Intercultural Competence, Spanish Translation and Interpretation, and Issues in Second Language Teaching.

Department of World Languages and Cultures Certificate Requirements:

1. World Language Proficiency - 10 hours

a. 1120 (4 hrs.), 2140 (3 hrs.), 2150 (3 hrs.) in one language

b. Score at the Intermediate low level on the ACTFL proficiency test or Avant STAMP test for French, German, Spanish; or at the Novice High level for Arabic, Chinese, Japanese. (Exams administered at end of semester.)

2. Intercultural Competence - 10 hours

a. FLAN 3440 Intercultural Communication: Principles and Practices (4 hrs.)

b. Any 2 culture courses from 1080, 1090, 1100 across our department's languages. These courses are taught in English, and some are available on-line.

- 3. Spanish Translation and Interpretation 10 Hours
 - a. SPAN 3170 Business Spanish (3 hrs.)
 - b. SPAN 4010 Syntax and Stylistics (4 hrs.)
 - c. SPAN 4060 Translation and Interpretation (3 hrs.)
- 4. Issues in Second Language Teaching (13 hrs.)
 - a. ENGL 3150 Linguistic Principles (3 hrs.)
 - b. FLAN 3440 Intercultural Communication: Principles and Practice (4 hrs.)
 - c. FLAN 4160 Teaching Colloquia (3 hrs.)

d. CI 4430 Issues in Second Language Teaching (3 hrs.) or ENGL 4210 Issues in ESL Writing (3 hrs.)

We teach Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Latin (on-line), and Spanish, beginning with the elementary level.

You can earn a <u>minor</u> in Arabic, French, German, Japanese, and Spanish. You can earn a <u>major</u> in French, German, and Spanish; or Asian Studies or Middle East Studies.
