Earn UT Credit in Spain

Earn 3 credit hours towards the foreign language requirement, a Spanish major or minor, or electives.

Location

A UNESCO World Heritage site since 1986, Toledo, Spain has been Toledo, Ohio's sister city since 1931.

Application Deadline February 15th, 2019

The Department of World Languages & Cultures is sponsoring a summer program at *Universidad de Castilla-La Mancha* in our sister city of Toledo, Spain. The program offers a four-week intensive study of Spanish language and culture. Included in the program are two day-long excursions to local sites of interest.

There is no more ideal place for studying Spanish culture than Toledo. Toledo affords students the richness of Spain's past while being conveniently close to Madrid and its world-class cultural events and shopping. With a high-speed train line linking Toledo and Madrid, a mere twenty minutes separates Toledo from Spain's capital.

Eligibility

Students with a minimum GPA of 2.5 and at least one year of college-level Spanish, or the equivalent, are eligible to apply. Students must demonstrate a desire to learn about the Spanish language and culture and have a flexible attitude toward living in a foreign culture. In addition to undergraduates, teachers or others who would like to revive or advance their language abilities in Spanish may apply. There will be three pre-departure information sessions at FH 2420 Conference Room on November 14TH at 3:00 PM; February 5TH at 2:45 PM; and March 12TH at 2:45 PM.

Course Credit

Students selected to participate in the program will earn 3 credits for the course. Language courses ranging from beginning to advanced are offered. Credit may be applied to the various UT college language requirements and/or a Spanish major or minor program. A placement test will be administered on site to determine the level of language study.

Program Cost

The final program cost will include tuition, room & board, and cultural activities, plus a round-trip flight from Detroit. Board consists of three meals a day (no meals provided on the weekends in the residence hall). The 2019 cost is € 2.290 for the residence hall option and € 2.340 for the homestay option. Students are required to pay for their own personal expenses. Students can apply for a Study Abroad Travel Grant from the Center for International Studies & Programs, an Association of Two Toledos Scholarship, and the Daniel E. Quilter ESTO scholarship to help defray the cost of the program.

Housing

Participants normally are housed in double rooms in a residence hall near the classroom site. The residence is air conditioned. Linen is provided. There is a housekeeping staff who clean the rooms. All dorm rooms have their own private bathroom, including shower. Meals are eaten in the residence. There are laundry facilities, a TV room, Wi-Fi access, and a small computer lab in the residence hall as well. Students from other countries and American universities also live in the dorm. For a higher cost, students may stay in single rooms in the dorm, or with a family.
