New Program Data Analytics in Economics concentration - Economics, BA

Rationale: The Harvard Business Review dedicated an entire issue to data science/data analytics (Davenport and Patil, 2017). Forbes reported a huge gap in those with the necessary skills to perform beginning-to-end data analysis. Marchand and Peppard (2017) recommend that data and analytics require people that are trained in the social sciences in order to effectively develop and utilize the data that they are able to access.

Summary: For Econ BA majors we are adding a new concentration, "Data Analytics in Economics".

To earn the concentration "Data Analytics in Economics", students must complete four of the following elective courses as part of their major:

1. DAAN 2/4000: Data Analytics Proseminar	(1 or 2)
2. ECON 3810: Applied Econometrics	(3)
3. ECON 4810: Econometrics Models and Methods I	(3)
4. ECON 4820: Econometrics Models and Methods II	(3) Econometrics

OR a substitution of one 3/4000 economics elective that includes a required data analysis component chosen in consultation with the economics undergraduate advisor.
