## Legal Programs, Scholarship, and Contests

#### **Grand Rapids Bar Association: Minority Clerkship Program**

The Minority Clerkship Program represents a collaborative effort between the Grand Rapids Bar Association and Floyd Skinner Bar Association, to increase the number of minority attorneys within the legal community of Grand Rapids, Michigan. By facilitating the placement of first-year minority law students in various law firms, corporations, and public interest clerkships; we hope to augment the representation of diverse constituencies, to further enrich the cultural landscape of West Michigan's legal

#### community.

The Minority Clerkship Program's ultimate goal is to provide qualified minority law students with professional development opportunities and practical legal experiences that will assist them in becoming successful law practitioners. Program participants are given real legal assignments, opportunities to meet with clients and access to the professional experience of full-time associates and partners, practicing law. The program is open to first-year minority law students who have an interest in exploring professional possibilities and opportunities, in West Michigan.

A prerequisite, for interested applicants, is completed course work in legal writing. Completed course work in legal writing is important, because much of the student's work product will involve written assignments. Students who are currently in their second year of law school or have completed more than 30 credits, prior to the start of the clerkship, are not eligible to participate. Deference will also be given to those students who have an interest in cultivating a connection with the West Michigan legal community. As with any summer associate position, successful participants will be expected to fully participate in professional activities of the law firm, corporation or public interest agency. This will also include social outings, as well as balancing the demands of producing quality legal work.

Interested candidates must submit the completed application, resume, cover letter, a short introductory video (no longer than five minutes) and first semester transcripts by **January 18, 2019.**

**Please Note**: In order to facilitate submission of applications by the above mentioned deadline, we will accept electronic copies of transcripts. However, an official copy must follow, by mail.

Students who submit the application, along with their resumes, cover letters, transcripts and introductory video, will be contacted for interviews by the Selection Committee. Interviews will be held at the Grand Rapids Campus of Thomas M. Cooley Law School, on **January 26 and 27, 2019**. Interviews will be held on a first-come first-interviewed basis and will last approximately 20-30 minutes. In the event of an increased number of applicants, interviews may be scheduled at the discretion of program administrators. Alternatively, for students attending school outside of Michigan who are unable to come to Michigan on the above mentioned date; arrangements may be made to conduct an interview via video conference (please note that it will be the responsibility of the applicant to set up video conference capabilities at his or her location).

Offers for summer clerkship positions will be extended, beginning **January 27**, **2019**. Students will be expected to commit to program participation, 48 hours after an offer has been extended.

The City of Chicago Department of Law is seeking Post-Graduate Fellows for 2019 The City of Chicago Department of Law invites graduating law students to apply for a Post-Grad Fellowship position for 2019. Post-Grad Fellows will participate in challenging work that reflects the demands and rewards of public service, as well as a realistic picture of what it is like to practice law for the City of Chicago. They must have funding in

place before they apply.

Post-Grad Fellows receive incomparable hands-on legal experience working side-byside with Department of Law attorneys. They will be assigned to work in a Law Department practice Division\* that interests them and participate in a wide variety of activities. Post-Grad Fellows may:

- assist in trial preparation;
- attend depositions;
- observe real estate closings;
- attend client meetings;
- attend court proceedings;
- conduct legal research and analysis; and
- draft memoranda, briefs, and contracts.

Post-Grad Fellows who qualify for an Illinois Supreme Court Rule 711 License may represent the City in:

- mandatory tort arbitrations in the Circuit Court of Cook County;
- grievance arbitration hearings and disciplinary proceedings before the Police Board and Human Resources Board;
- prosecutions of Municipal Code Violations in Administrative Hearings or in the Circuit Court of Cook County;
- cases before the Circuit Court of Cook County (Criminal, Civil and Chancery Divisions) and Federal Court:
- hearings before the Department of Administrative Hearings and the Department of Business Affairs and Licensing;
- settlement agreement negotiations; and
- real estate closings.

They may also depose or examine witnesses in trials in State and Federal Court.

The Law Department seeks talented, promising individuals from a wide variety of backgrounds. The Law Department is committed to increasing opportunities for minorities in the legal profession, and it is proud that its staff reflects the racial, cultural, and ethnic diversity of Chicago. #### Shumaker, Loop, and Kendrick, LLP Diversity Scholarship

The Shumaker Diversity Scholarship provides a \$7,500.00 scholarship to two (2) outstanding first or

second year law students who are enrolled at an ABA accredited law school and who participate in

the firm's summer associate program, to assist in offsetting his or her law school expenses. The

scholarship is in addition to the salary paid to the student for his or her Summer Associate position.

The Shumaker Diversity Scholarship is available to students who are members of underrepresented or minority groups. Applicants must have outstanding undergraduate and

law school academic credentials, and demonstrated leadership abilities and community involvement. Applicants must also demonstrate a commitment to practice law after graduating

from law school in the geographic area of one of our firm's offices.

Eligibility for the Shumaker Diversity Scholarship requires that the recipient participate in and

complete the firm's summer associate program following his or her first or second year of law

school, for a minimum of eight weeks. Shumaker will select the office in which the student will

work, but will attempt to place the student in the office location of his or her choice. The scholarship

will be paid upon the student's completion of the firm's summer associate program.

Students who are interested in applying for the Shumaker Diversity Scholarship must submit

the following documents:

- 1. A completed application form, together with a current law school transcript. (contact OPD for application, or see Symplicity)
- 2. A current resume, including a description of the applicant's academic and leadership skills,

community involvement, and personal and professional accomplishments.

- 3. A description of why the student believes that diversity is important and how his or her identified diverse background(s) would contribute to that philosophy.
- 4. A legal writing sample.
- 5. Letters of recommendation from three academic or professional references.


