New Students (Combined) Fall 2005 Highlights

- ➤ The University of Toledo's new student population has become more ethnically diverse, as the percentages of Black and Hispanic students have increased since Fall 2003, while the percentage of White students has decreased (see Table 1.2).
- ➤ Enrollment of new students has increased in the College of Arts & Sciences and the College of Business, as enrollment of new students has decreased in the Student Success Center and the College of Education (see Table 1.4).
- ➤ The top three majors with the most new student enrollments are Undecided, Pre-Pharmacy, and Pre-Business (see Table 1.6).
 - o While Undecided is the top major, the number of new students with Undecided as a major has dropped from 705 in Fall 2003 to 562 in Fall 2005.
- About 90% of the new student population has enrolled for a full course load this fall, which is an increase over Fall 2003 when about 88% of the new student population was enrolled full-time (see Table 1.7).
- The average high school grade point average of all incoming new students for Fall 2005 is 3.07, which is up from the previous two years (see Table 1.8).
- ➤ The University of Toledo has attracted 249 out-of-state new students this fall, which is an increase over the last two fall terms (see Table 1.9).
- ➤ Other than Ohio and Michigan, the top four states new students came from are Illinois, California, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania (see Table 1.10).
- ➤ The number of scholarships offered by the University of Toledo this fall has more than doubled since last fall term, with scholarship offers made to 1,794 students with need and 1,048 first-generation students (see Table and Figure 1.15).
- Total need-based scholarship dollars offered to students for Fall 2005 was \$2,560,944, compared to \$184,500 offered in Fall 2004 (see Figure 1.12).
- > Total merit-based scholarship dollars offered was \$10,081,116 this fall, compared to \$3,968,115 last fall (see Figures 1.13).
- The total amount of scholarship dollars that were offered by the University of Toledo for Fall 2005, including both merit-based and need-based, was \$12,642,060, which is an increase of about \$8.5 million over last fall (see Figure 1.15).

















New DHS Students Fall 2005 Highlights

- ➤ The University of Toledo's Fall 2005 new direct from high school (DHS) student population has become more ethnically diverse than the previous two fall terms, with increased numbers of Black and Hispanic students and fewer White students (see Table 2.2).
- ➤ Enrollment of new DHS students has increased in the College of Arts & Sciences and the College of Business and has decreased in the Student Success Center and the College of Education (see Table 2.4).
- The top three majors with the most new DHS student enrollments are Undecided, Pre-Pharmacy, and Pre-Business (see Table 2.6).
 - o While Undecided is the top major, the number of new DHS students with Undecided as a major has dropped from 519 in Fall 2003 to 438 in Fall 2005.
- New DHS students have come from 588 different high schools, with the top feeder schools being Sylvania Southview, Whitmer, Central Catholic, and Sylvania Northview (see Table 2.8).
- > Overall academic preparedness has increased for the new DHS student population.
 - o The average high school GPA of the incoming DHS students has gone up from 3.07 in both Fall 2003 and Fall 2004 to 3.12 in Fall 2005 (see Table 2.9).
 - o The average ACT score has also increased slightly from 21.4 in Fall 2004 to 21.8 this term (see Table 2.10).
 - o The average SAT score has also gone up over the past year, with the average for Fall 2004 being 1026, and the average for Fall 2005 being 1041 (see Table 2.11).
- The University has attracted more out-of-state and Michigan reciprocity DHS students this fall (102 and 120 respectively) when compared to the last two fall terms (see Table 2.12).
- Aside from Ohio and Michigan, the states in which the most DHS students come from are Illinois, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania (see Table 2.13).




Table and Figure 2.3 New DHS Students Enrollment by Age Group









New Adult Students Fall 2005 Highlights

- ➤ Unlike the other new student categories, the ethnic breakdown of the new adult student population has remained fairly stable, although the percentage of White students has increased since Fall 2003 (see Table 3.2).
- ➤ Enrollment of new adult students has increased in the College of Arts & Sciences and has decreased in the Student Success Center and University College (see Table 3.4).
- The top four majors with the most new adult student enrollments are Undecided, Special Undecided, Pre-Business, and Communication (see Table 3.6).
 - o While Undecided is the top major, the number of new adult students with Undecided as a major has dropped from 82 in Fall 2003 to 50 in Fall 2005.
 - o The number of new adult students with a major of Special Undecided has also declined over the past couple of years from 26 in Fall 2003 to 17 in Fall 2005.
- About 67% of the new adult student population has enrolled for a full course load this fall, which is an increase over Fall 2003 when about 62% of the new student population was enrolled full-time (see Table 3.7).
- The average high school grade point average of new adult students for this fall is 2.52, which is an increase over the last two fall terms (see Table 3.8).
- The percentage of out-of-state new adult students has increased this fall to 4.9%, compared to 2.1% in Fall 2003 and 2.3% Fall 2004 (see Table 3.9).





New Transfer Students Fall 2005 Highlights

- ➤ The University of Toledo's Fall 2005 new transfer student population has become more ethnically diverse when compared to the previous two fall terms, with increased numbers of Black and Hispanic students and fewer White students (see Table 4.2).
- ➤ Enrollment of new transfer students has increased in the College of Arts & Sciences and has decreased in the Student Success Center and University College (see Table 4.4).
- The top three majors with the most new transfer student enrollments, aside from Conditional are Pre-Pharmacy, Undecided, and Early Childhood Education (see Table 4.6).
 - o While Undecided is one of the top majors, the number of new transfer students with Undecided as a major has dropped from 86 in Fall 2003 to 48 in Fall 2005.
- The average cumulative transfer grade point average of the new fall transfer students is 2.65, which has remained fairly steady since Fall 2003 when the average 2.68 (see Table 4.8).
- ➤ The top three 4-year institutions from which new Fall 2005 transfer students have transferred to the University of Toledo are Ohio State University, Bowling Green State University, and Kent State University (see Table 4.11).
- ➤ The top two 2-year institutions from which new Fall 2005 transfer students have transferred are Owens Community College and Monroe County Community College (see Table 4.12).
- ➤ The University of Toledo has attracted 70 out-of-state new transfer students this fall, which is an increase over the last two fall terms (see Table 4.13).



Enrollment by Gender Fall 2003-05






