POLICY

The Graduate Medical Education training program must select individuals appropriately qualified to enter and complete a graduate medical education curriculum.

PURPOSE

This policy will ensure fair and equitable selection of qualified physicians to enter into GME training at The University of Toledo (UT).

PROCEDURE

1. Resident Eligibility: Applicants with one of the following qualifications are eligible for appointment to UT residency programs:

- Graduates of medical schools in the US or Canada accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME).
 - a. Candidates must have taken and passed USMLE Step 1, USMLE Step 2CK and Step 2CS prior to graduation from medical school.
- Graduates of schools of osteopathic medicine in the US, accredited by the American Osteopathic Association (AOA).
 - a. Candidates must have taken and passed COMLEX Level 1 and COMLEX Level 2 and COMLEX Level 2PE; or USMLE Step 1, USMLE Step 2CK and Step 2CS, prior to graduation from medical school.
- Candidates for residency in the Department of Dentistry must be graduates of Schools of Dentistry in the US or Canada accredited by the American Dental Association.
- Graduates of medical schools outside the US or Canada who meet one of the following qualifications:
 - a. <u>Have receivedHolding</u> a currently valid certificate from the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) prior to appointment,

or;

Specialty/Subspecialty

- b. <u>HoldingHave</u> a full and unrestricted license or temporary training certificate to practice medicine in the state of Ohio.
- Graduates of medical schools outside the US who have completed a Fifth Pathway program provided by an LCME-accredited medical school.
- Fellow candidates, including Child and Adolescent Psychiatry fellows, must have passed USMLE Step 3 or COMLEX Level 3 prior to the beginning of the fellowship program as a requirement for eligibility.
- 2. Resident Selection:
 - Residency Programs must select from among eligible applicants on the basis of residency program-related criteria such as their preparedness, ability, aptitude, academic credentials, communication skills and personal qualities such as motivation and integrity. The Sponsoring Institution and Residency Program will not discriminate with regard to sex, race, age, religion, color, national origin, disability, or any other applicable legally protected status. Performance in medical school, personal letters of recommendation, achievements, humanistic qualities, and qualities thought important to the desired specialty will be used in the selection process.
 - UT GME programs participate in the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP) in selecting residents.
 - Specialty program selecting residents from organized national matching programs other than NRMP are as follows:
